Wisdom is the art of living well. This requires an apprenticeship that most of us come to late, after many mistakes and in a very imperfect way. However, God never ceases to show us the way and to make things easier for us, never giving up.

"These people honour me with their lips, but their heart is far from me. Their worship of me is empty, for the doctrine they teach is human precepts. True worship is that which establishes a concordance between the lips and the heart; that which springs from a heart attached to God.

Jesus also criticises them because they set aside the commandment of God in order to cling to the tradition of men. This way of trivialising the word of God is serious, and it destroys true religion, in which God must have the first place, and everything else must take second place.

This behaviour is a constant in the history of religions. Jesus takes the opportunity to instruct people about something very important and liberating at the same time, and which has not been learned and accepted by some religions: Only what comes out of the heart defiles a man, not what goes in through the mouth. But our heart will be truly pure if it is attached to the source of holiness and purity. Do I seek the wisdom that comes from God? Do I listen with respect to God's Word and hope that it will transform me? Is my heart attached to God, or is it more attentive to other realities or people?

When they come to know of all these laws they will exclaim, "No other people is as wise and prudent as this great nation." And indeed, what great nation is there that has its gods so near as the Lord our God is to us whenever we call to him? A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture: This people honours me only with lipservice, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations. You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.' He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.' The Gospel of the Lord.
