Deaf Christians: they are those who repeat inside themselves "the same old thing", what they have learned and are losing the power of the Spirit. They have closed their ears and sometimes consider themselves to be experts in the Word, without feeling that Jesus continues to call them in the new. They live self absorbed and in continuous self referentiality.

And there are mute Christians: who, out of fear or lack of confidence, or because they never feel ready, have never pronounced the name of Jesus to others, nor have they told their experience of salvation; they fulfil, pray, live the commandments and read the Bible: but they renounce to be witnesses.

Faith has this double dynamism that nourishes it: we are open to God in his Word and in the signs of the times, but at the same time we speak, with our lips and deeds, of what the Lord is doing in us. One leads to the other! Are we aware of the greatness of baptism and of the faith we profess? Are we people of fraternity and hope, of healing encounters without prejudice? Then the ears of the deaf shall be opened and the tongues of the dumb speak. Say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.'

Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer

Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that? Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him. GOSPEL Mark 7:31-37

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.' The Gospel of the Lord.
