The Gospel text is built on a situation: questioning the inheritance of eternal life. He does not seek to be successful in this world, nor to be part of the elect, nor to belong to a religious elite..., but to possess eternal life. The young man's concern and what he wants to know is to obtain eternal life. Jesus' answer is that one needs an attitude of compassion towards others, support in remedying their needs and not to have a heart attached to temporal goods, in addition to keeping the other commandments, of course. This is the only way to follow Jesus and live in the kingdom of God. The young man failed to detach himself from earthly goods. Human life may have many desirable things, but there is one thing that cannot be obtained and cannot be attained by oneself. Eternal life is an unattainable prize for everyone. It can only be prepared for: it is done by the fulfilment of all human righteousness. The young man

fulfilled that righteousness in the popular mind: fulfilment of the commands; he lacked only one thing for the good disposition: to sell what one possesses and give it to the poor. Covetousness and greed for goods is incompatible with the detachment and prodigality that eternal life demands. "Give to the poor, so that you may have treasure in heaven" (Mk 10:21). In what sense to distribute goods is to treasure. In what sense and in what form is eternal life already in us?

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth. Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another, 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said, 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'
